

Kingston, Ontario, December 6, 2023 – If all you want for Christmas is some side-splitting entertainment, then “Domin-Ho-Ho-Hoooo!!! Theatre has gift-wrapped just the right thing with its staging of the holiday classic *A Christmas Story*.

Adapted by Philip Grecian from the Genie Award-winning movie and Jean Shepherd’s semi-autobiographical collections of short stories *In God We Trust: All Others Pay Cash* and *Wanda Hickey’s Night of Golden Memories*, and directed by Dale Jones, *A Christmas Story* is hilarious romp in which 9-year-old Ralphie Parker seeks to convince his mother, his teacher, and even Santa Claus himself, that an official Red Ryder Carbine-Action 200-Shot Range Model Air Rifle should be under his tree on Christmas morning.

Along the way, the Parker Family must contend with an infamous leg lamp, a pair of pink bunny pyjamas only a mother could find adorable, an unconvinced department store Santa, and a triple-dog-dare to lick a freezing flagpole.
