

Ten Lost Years is based on Barry Broadfoot's best-selling oral history of Canada's Great Depression of the 1930s, a book that takes us beyond the headlines and statistics. The play, a Canadian classic that toured across Canada and the world, brings to life the universal stories of the hoboes, farmers, waitresses, and privileged few who lived through it all. Sadly, with homelessness and food insecurity pressing issues in our country, their stories continue to resonate.

ABOUT THE DIRECTOR

Martha Bailey began acting in the 1960s with the Etobicoke Children's Players, studied speech arts and drama at the Royal Conservatory of Music and acting at Ryerson College, and has worked as an actor, painter, playwright, director, etc., at theatres in Ontario, Quebec, and Vermont.




ABOUT THE PLAYWRIGHTS



Born in Bournemouth, England, **Cedric Smith** came to Canada aged 10, dropped out of school to become a folksinger and later took up acting. He won a Gemini award for his role in the TV series **Road to Avonlea**.



George Luscombe grew up in Toronto, studied theatre in England, and in 1958 founded what became Toronto Workshop Productions, of which he was director until 1986. He favoured collaborative productions and adaptations of non-theatrical material.



Born in Moose Jaw and educated in Montreal and Toronto, **Jack Winter** wrote plays, films, TV scripts, fiction and nonfiction, and taught theatre and creative writing at several universities in Canada and the U.K.



Barry Broadfoot was born in Winnipeg in 1921 and started work as a reporter at the age of 17. He worked as a journalist and oral historian, travelling across Canada to interview many ordinary people for books about the Great Depression, World War II and other topics.



ABOUT THE PLAY

The play is based on the 1973 best-selling book of the same name by Canadian journalist Barry Broadfoot, who travelled all over Canada interviewing ordinary people to compile their stories and memories of The Great Depression. Their words, exactly as told to Broadfoot (himself, a child of The Depression), are the text of the play. They tell of failed farms and businesses; of riding the rails back and forth across the country in a mostly fruitless search for work; of rising unemployment, falling wages and the shame of taking government relief.

The 1974 original production of *Ten Lost Years* toured all ten provinces over 42 weeks, playing to about 66,000 Canadians.

Andrea would like to dedicate her performance to her grandmother Eva Van Slyke, who took on washing to feed her 8 sons, on her own, during the Great Depression.



For a long-time fan of music by the likes of Woody Guthrie and the Carter Family, being part of the cast for this show has been anything but depressing.


Hobo/Frank/Manager


He currently resides in Kingston with his daughter.



Grant Buckler first appeared on the Domino stage in 1991.



The best production, as selected by our panel of three judges, will go on the road to the Eastern Ontario Drama League's One-Act Festival in November 2024.



She has recently graduated from Queens university and received a Bachelors of Music with a specialization in Vocal Performance.



When he is not singing, dancing, or acting, he enjoys going for long hikes in nature or reading a good book with a strong cup of earl grey.




